Some dreams seem totally silly, and it's not surprising that some people say they are best forgotten. But other dreams cannot be so easily <u>dismissed</u>. <u>These</u> are the very frightening ones. Often their impression is so strong that the memory continues to haunt us for years. There are other dreams of such beauty that we would not have missed them, and still other so <u>vivid</u> and full of life that we wonder whether they could be visions of another world or a quick view of some earlier life.

Science is still a long way from having any comprehensive understanding of dreams. However, some modern research showed that the majority of dreams seem in some way to reflect things that have **preoccupied** our minds during the previous day or two. Sometimes this is easy to see, but some other dreams seem to be worlds away from our ordinary life, like being chased down by a tiger or **conversing** with a dead person. Once we understand dreams it can be seen that the tiger symbolized someone we're scared of, while the dead person appeared to remind us of an old idea we forgot.

There is probably some basis to the old idea of being able to tackle life's difficulties and deal with them simply by "sleeping on them"; best ideas can come to you when you least expect them. In fact, what we do know is that when dreams are remembered, and their deep reflections are understood, a whole new dimension of wisdom is added to life, bringing greater logic, meaning, and humor into our existence.

The "battle of the sexes" is immortal. The opinion that men are superior to women has long been accepted in many cultures, but the feminist movement is trying to change this view. Feminists claim that boys and girls are equal at birth but become unequal because of the society. However, recent research contradicts the view that males and females are by birth alike.

Societal influences inside and outside the family can cause the differences between sexes. Inside the family, boys learn to be men by <u>imitating</u> their fathers and girls learn to be women by imitating their mothers. Outside the family, boys shouldn't play with dolls; and girls with ninja turtles after a certain age.

However, not all differences are caused by societal influences. <u>Some</u> are due to differences in the physiology of the brain. For example, more men than women are left-handed. This indicates that the right side of men's brains, which controls the left side of the body, is dominant. Right-brain people have better reasoning abilities. Girls are better at language than boys. For both men and women, the language center is on the left side of the brain. However, girls can speak more clearly and develop larger vocabularies.

Men and women have different spatial abilities. For example, men are better at turning three-dimensional objects in their heads. Women often have to turn a map around to figure it out, whereas men can do it in their heads. On the other hand, women excel at other spatial tasks such as remembering the location of objects in a random pattern.
